# Wild Rose Independent Film Festival Awards Top Filmmakers

The 2009 Wild Rose Independent Film Festival highlighted its 7<sup>th</sup> annual event with an inspiring Keynote Speech given by independent film champion, John Putch of Putch Films, during its Awards Ceremony Saturday held at the State Historical Building of Iowa where the WRIFF winners were announced to an audience which included filmmakers from Iowa and across the world. Putch is known for his highly quality, award-winning micro budget indie films, *Route 30* and *Mojave Phone Booth*, as well as for his Hollywood directing credits of *Ugly Betty, Scrubs* and *My Name is Earl*.

The 2009 Wild Rose spanned four days with screenings, educational opportunities and film advocacy. In addition to the four days of screenings, the WRIFF included an "Auditioning Skills Workshop" taught by LA actress, acting coach and casting director, Jamie Rose of JRose Studio and a "No Budget Independent Filmmaking Seminar" held by John Putch. A "State of the Industry" meeting was co-sponsored by the Iowa Motion Picture Association (also one the festival sponsors) and the Wild Rose. Video testimonials promoting filmmaking and advocating restoring the film tax incentives program in Iowa were taped and will be made available to lawmakers and posted on websites.

The WRIFF culminated on Sunday with AriesWorks Entertainment's special premiere Des Moines screening of the Iowa independent feature film, *Haunting Villisca*, based on the unsolved 1912 Villisca Axe murders and the current paranormal activity in the house where the crime took place. The film (not in competition at the festival) played to a packed house. *Haunting Villisca* is an Iowa film directed by James Serpento and produced by Kimberly Busbee and also was cowritten by them.

This year's WRIFF showcased 35 short, animated, documentary, music and feature films from Iowa, the U.S. and other countries, including Canada, the UK, France, Japan, Germany, China and Mexico. These selected films were juried into the Wild Rose from a pool of over 200 submitted films. The Wild Rose Independent Film Festival gives two types of awards to the winners; the top level award is named "Best of" and "Certificate of Distinctive Achievement" is the runner up award. Over fifty awards were given.
